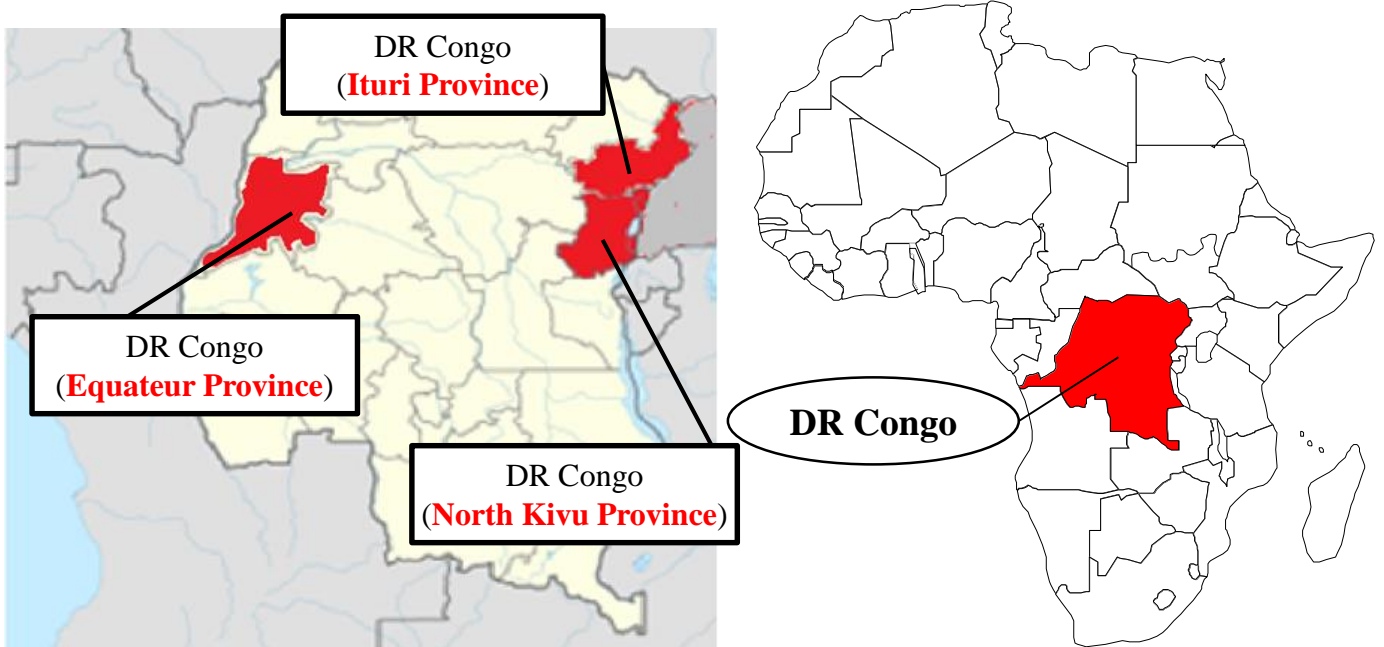


There has been an outbreak of Ebola hemorrhagic fever in North Kivu, Ituri, and Equateur Provinces of the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

If you were staying in
Democratic Republic of the Congo,
please report this to a quarantine official.

➤ If you have come into contact with, for example, someone with Ebola hemorrhagic fever in one of those places, be sure to declare this to a quarantine official.



Ebola hemorrhagic fever is a disease with a high mortality rate (25% to 90%). Infection is by contact with humans or animals that are infected with the virus.

The latency period is 2 to 21 days, typically about 7 days, after which fever, fatigue, muscle pain, headache, and throat pain develop suddenly. These are followed by vomiting, diarrhea, and decreased kidney and liver function, sometimes progressing to bleeding from the entire body.
