

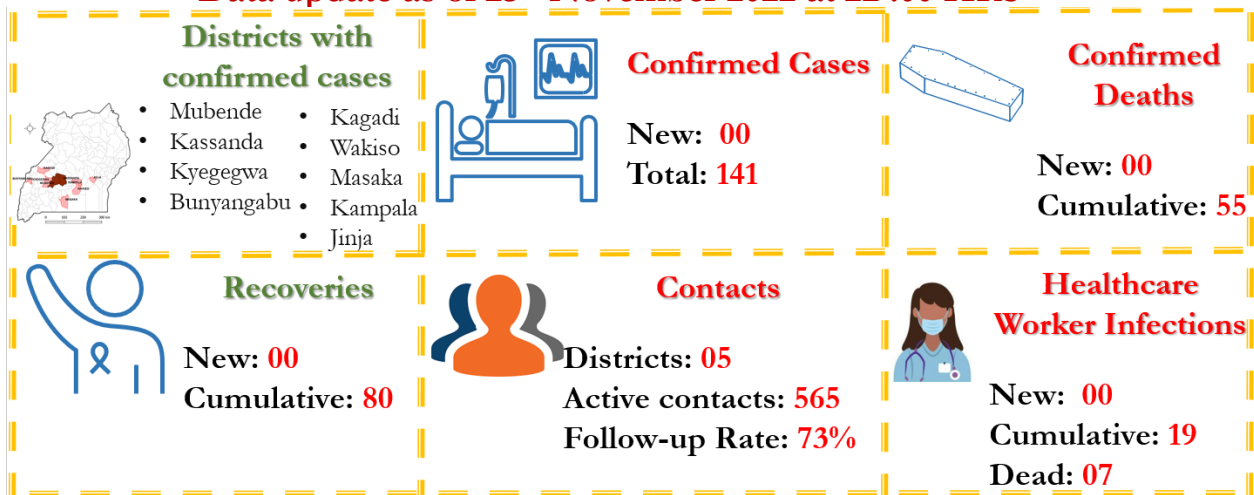

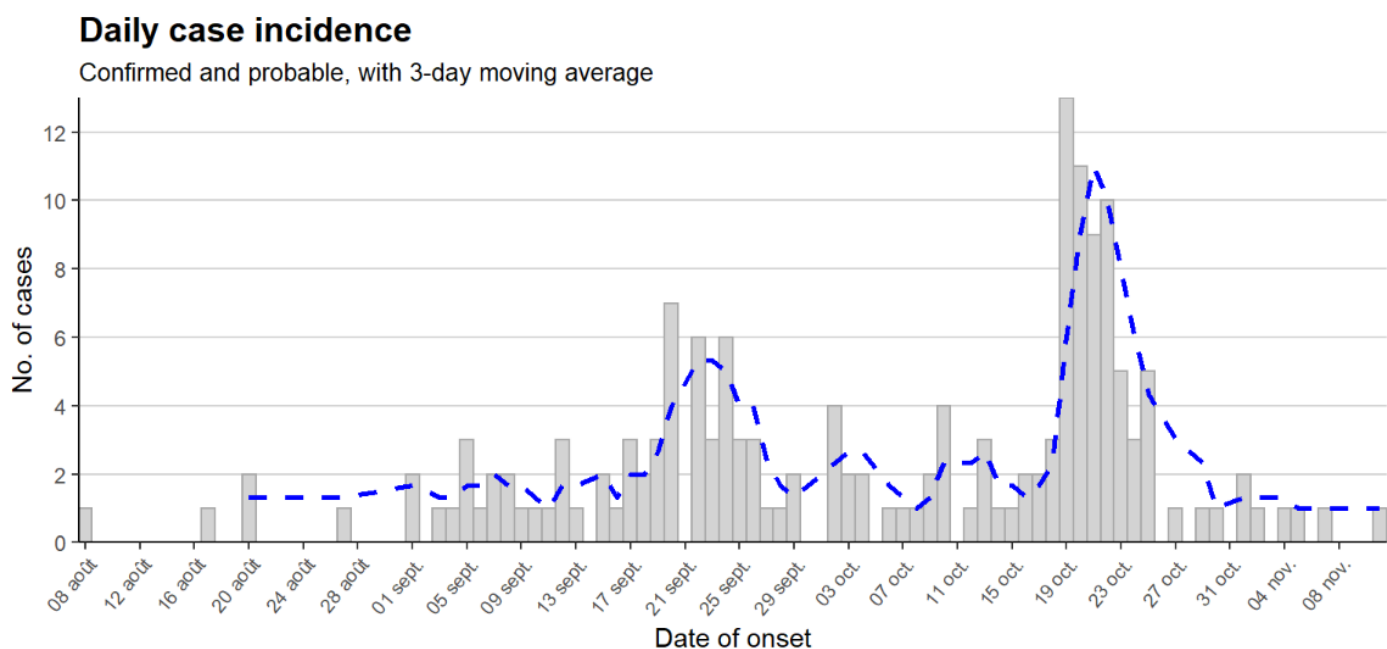

### Background

On 20<sup>th</sup> September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan Ebola Virus (SVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This followed investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus

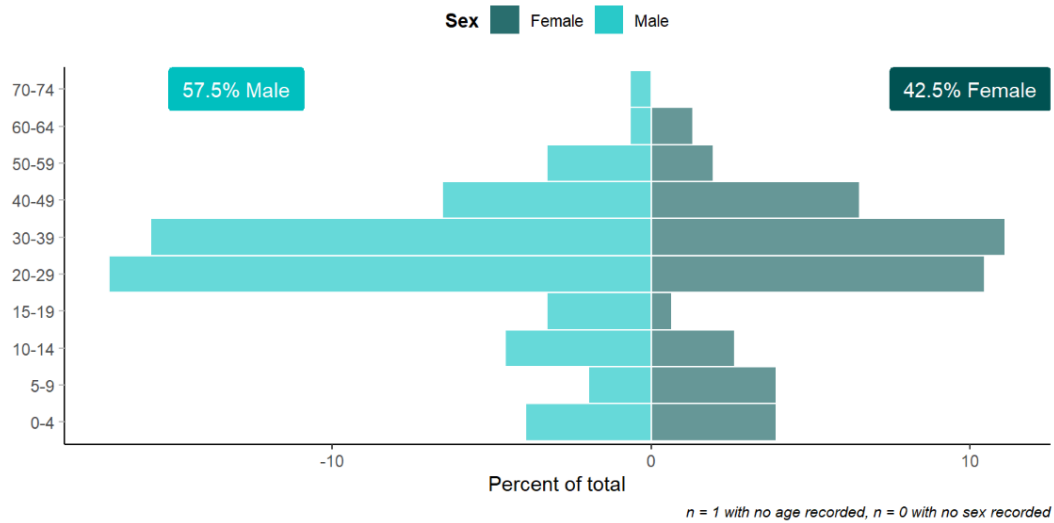
- Today marks 70 days of responding to the EVD outbreak, and twelve (12) days since the last confirmed case was reported
- Within the past 24 hours, there was no new confirmed case or death registered, there was no recovery.
- Case Fatality Ratio (CFR) among confirmed cases still stands 55/141 (39%).
- A total of 565 contacts actively being followed-up in five districts, follow-up rate in the past 24 hours was 73%.

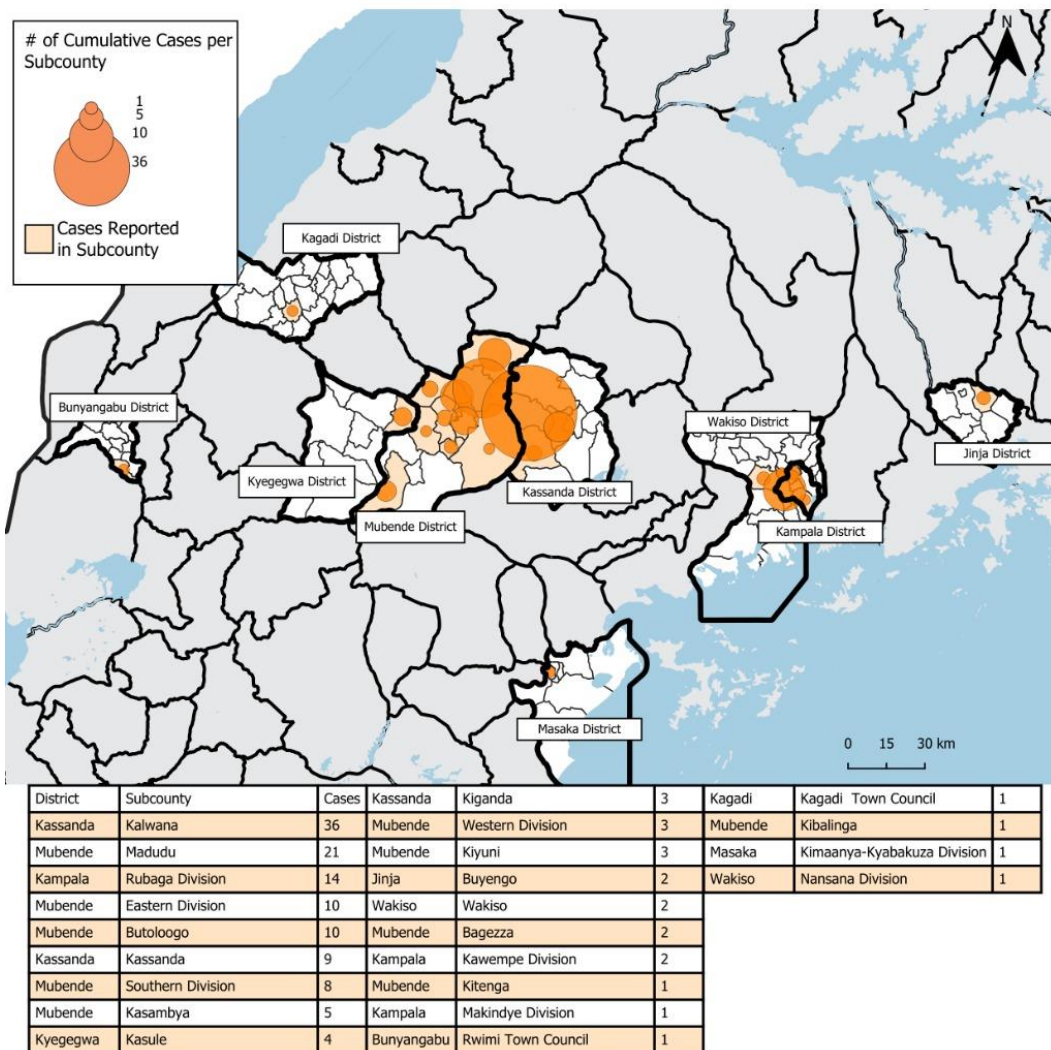

### Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:

**Response Pillar**

**Key Updates in the past 24 hours**

<p><i>Coordination</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Daily DTF meetings in all affected districts happened normally including Jinja and Masaka, NTF meetings are thrice a week.</li> <li>➤ Security personnel strategically positioned to enforce presidential lockdown directives from Kassanda and Mubende</li> </ul>
<p><i>Surveillance &amp; Contact tracing</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Active contacts in the past 24-hours are 565 within five districts. Follow up rate stands at 73%.</li> <li>➤ Total alerts validated from districts with active contacts within the past 24-hours were 71, of which 30 met the suspected case definition and 20 were evacuated.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Laboratory</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Uploaded 121 results for 23 districts with 00 district registering a confirmed case</li> <li>➤ Cumulative samples tested are 3,751 with 141 testing POSITIVE for EVD (SUD)</li> </ul>
<p><i>Case Management</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Bed occupancy rates within the past 24 hours stood at 21/86 (24.4%) in Mubende isolation units.</li> <li>➤ Completed case management training for 88 HCWs from Mubende and 8 neighbouring districts.</li> <li>➤ There is ongoing case management training of 50 health workers in Jinja.</li> <li>➤ The quarantine facility in Jinja has been operationalised, there are 07 high risk contacts currently.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Emergency Medical Services</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Within the past 24 hours, teams undertook a total of 45 EMS evacuations (Mubende - 28, Kassanda - 13, Masaka - 01, and Jinja - 03). Nine (09) clients declined evacuation.</li> <li>➤ Team experiencing challenges of impassable roads due to heavy rains.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Safe &amp; Dignified Burials</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ A total of 09 death alerts received from the three districts (Mubende, Kassanda and Kyegegwa) 07 verified and samples collected from 05 of the alerts.</li> <li>➤ Conducted 10 safe and dignified burials in Mubende, Kassanda within the past 24 hours - cumulative SDBs conducted currently stand at 282</li> <li>➤ One backlog case in the past 24 hours - family were not yet ready.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Risk Communication &amp; Public Awareness</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Four radio talk shows: one in Kyegegwa, one in Mubende, and two in Jinja.</li> <li>➤ Two TV talk shows featuring Ministry of Health Top Management</li> <li>➤ At least 140 radio spots/messages continue to be aired daily through the local radio stations in Mubende, Kassanda, Kagadi/Kakumiro, Buyangabu, Jinja, Masaka and Kyegegwa.</li> <li>➤ Community sensitization activities ongoing in Jinja, Masaka, Kassanda, Mubende, and Kampala.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Social Mobilisation</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ A total of 213 households were reached with EVD messages during the integrated RCCE/Active case search by VHTs in Najjanankumbi and Masanyalaze in Kampala.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Stakeholder Engagement</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ RCCE team Engaged 116 individuals ( included; 93 – religious leaders, 10 – Cultural leaders, 13- taskforce members and district leaders) in Kassanda.</li> <li>➤ In Jinja with support from the community leaders; conducted 03 Community dialogues and 23 schools were sensitized in Buwenge sub-county. 2,421 individuals reached with SBCC Messages on EVD and psychosocial support provided to the contacts.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Community Engagement</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ RCCE team distributed 158 EVD posters in both Lusoga and English. These were distributed to schools, HF's and trading centers in Busedde and Buyengo SCs</li> <li>➤ RCCE teams in Jinja with support of the community health workers conducted 03 community dialogue meetings Isiri, Busegula and Lwabongo villages in Buyengo T/C. These reached 28(14M and 10F) primary school teachers with SBCC messages on EVD.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Logistics</i></p>	<p><b>Orders and Deliveries</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Weekly and Bi-weekly orders (PPE and selected Case management commodities) sent to NMS to support the ETU and priority districts respectively.</li> <li>➤ Adequate Stock available at national level (NMS, WHO, UNICEF warehouses) for PPE, IPC/WASH and Laboratory consumables and pipeline on track for coveralls, thermometers from WHO and UNICEF</li> </ul> <p><b>Food and Fleet Management</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Fleet maintained to support Surveillance, Coordination, Laboratory, SDB, Surveillance, CES and other activities.</li> <li>➤ All ETUs are being provided with meals</li> <li>➤ The continues to offer transport services for Consumables from NMS to all the affected districts and Last Mile Delivery to PFP/PNFP sites.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Mental Health &amp; Psychosocial Social Support</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>ETU SUPPORT:</b> Supportive counseling offered to four confirmed clients; Psychosocial support offered to 37 clients at the emergency ward, Madudu and MOW ETU.</li> <li>➤ <b>RESETTLEMENT:</b> Fourteen (14) clients from ETU MOW, 05 clients from ETU Madudu were escorted back home.</li> <li>➤ <b>SURVIVOR FOLLOW-UP:</b> Clinic runs on Monday, Wednesday.</li> </ul>

## Key messages to the public

- ➔ People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhoea or urine, bleeding from body openings).
- ➔ Hotline numbers are: **0800200043** for Mubende and Kassanda; **0800299000** for Kampala Metropolitan Area, **0800300043** for Masaka, **0800355411** for Kagadi all toll-free, **0800300046** for Jinja, and **0787437139** for Bunyangabu (not toll-free).
- ➔ Free alert SMS on **6767** starting with the 'ALERT' key word; Free alert SMS to U-report on 8500
- ➔ Community should not fear people who have been discharged from the ETU and returned home.
